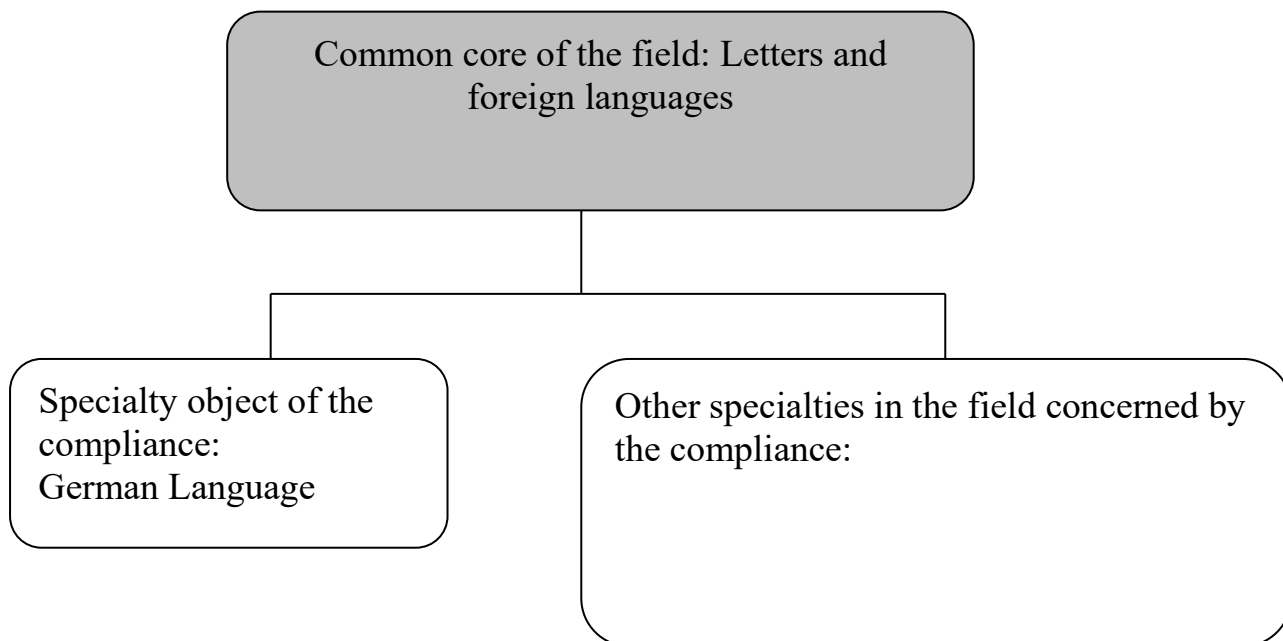

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3- Context and objectives of the formation

A - General organization of formation: Position of the project

B - Formation objectives (targeted skills, knowledge acquired at the end of the formation - maximum 20 lines)

The creation of an academic bachelor's degree **in foreign languages with a field to a German bachelor's degree** meets a specific formation need for students wishing to apply for recruitment exams for high school teachers as well as for candidates for the academic Master's degree (Translation, Applied Language).

In terms of developing language skills, it is important for us to provide students with knowledge and skills that will enable them to undertake projects, in particular in the field of technical language and translation from German into German, as well as the teaching of German as a foreign language. At the same time, students will be gradually prepared for the Master's Degree phase in these fields.

The objective of this degree is to provide **specialized teaching and to train qualified translators and interpreters** (5th and 6th semesters) during which students will focus on:

- The German language and other Germanic languages
- Other optional foreign languages chosen
- General linguistics of language
- Translation from German into other languages
- Language and civilization of German-speaking countries
- Teaching German as a Foreign Language.

C - Profiles and skills targeted:

Targeted Areas of Activity

-Development and deepening of knowledge and skills in translation and interpreting, in linguistics and teaching of German, in this case languages, from an interdisciplinary perspective; research methodology;

-Acquisition of a specialization in translation and interpreting, in the teaching of German as a foreign language (DaF = Deutsch als Fremdsprache), or as a language for specific purposes in settings other than strictly "school" settings: continuing education, adult education, training of specific audiences taking into account differentiated learning needs;

-Development of skills in translation, contrastive linguistics and production of teaching materials (particularly multimedia).

-The objective here is to provide students with conceptual and methodological tools that they will be likely to use subsequently depending on both their own backgrounds and their specific projects: opening onto translation and interpreting, research on didactics (language teaching), on German as a foreign language (DaF), on the paramedical sector (speech therapy in particular), on the communication sector, on the linguistic engineering sector.

-This specialization is particularly aimed at students for whom the act of reading or writing texts is both a writing practice and a free pleasure; it also provides the necessary tools for those who later intend to work in the field of Translation and higher education and/or research in contrastive linguistics and Translation. It naturally concerns students who wish to subsequently prepare a doctorate in the same specialization.

- Research and university teaching in contrastive linguistics (Master and academic doctorate)
- Fields of communication (Mass media: written press, Radio, Television, Intranet and Internet)

Indeed, more and more people today are concerned by the diversity of cultures and the complexity of intercultural relations during meetings, exchanges, cooperation, and even conflicts. Current globalization rather reveals cultures, in the sense that it brings together their similarities and differences. Learning a foreign language can no longer be reduced to learning a linguistic technique or to accumulating civilizational knowledge. A new dimension is inevitably added: Intercultural training.

This subject offers an in-depth overview of the field of Contrastive Linguistics, Translation and the teaching of German as a Foreign Language DaF by exploiting the possibilities of Information and Communication Technologies: it offers both theoretical tools for analyzing and translating texts and communicative situations and practical tools for working in professional contexts (Translation teaching and training, consultancy activities for companies providing didactic training for their staff), and in particular of German as a Foreign Language DaF. Discourse analysis aims to study all verbal production, to analyze all statements in context, as opposed to the study of language out of context. Knowing that a discourse is a transphrastic, oriented, active, and interactive structure, all corpora are possible, from dinner table conversations to discourse analysis treatises themselves.

Knowledge of the basics of general linguistics and information and communication sciences. Various literary and linguistic trends whose content corresponds to the curriculum of the German degree.

Material content:

In this subject related to discourse analysis, which is a methodological approach of social and human sciences, the student will be familiarized with the different possibilities of exploiting a discourse of different nature. Being a multidisciplinary qualitative and quantitative approach, this subject concerning discourse analysis will study the context and content of oral or written discourse.

Many concepts from the fields of sociology, philosophy, psychology, computer science, communication sciences, linguistics, and history will be analyzed. A variety of subjects, such as political, religious, scientific, and artistic discourse, will be analyzed. This subject focuses on the concepts, linguistics, and narrative organization of oral and written discourse it studies.

Within the framework of this subject, the main objective is to give students the skills to transmit literary content (texts, works, articles, etc.) in methodological and psychopedagogical matters. It is also a question of enabling them to develop a didacticization of the content object of the different literary programs.

The knowledge acquired in the German degree program, mainly in the subjects of didactics, educational psychology and methodology, is required to ensure the continued development of this new subject.

In this subject, we will examine the theories, aims and methods that underpin translation/interpreting, the teaching of contrastive linguistics in German as a foreign language DaF:

- Why practice Translation, teach contrastive linguistics in German as a foreign language DaF?

- What does the text to be translated into German as a foreign language (DaF) represent?

- How to teach contrastive linguistics in German as a foreign language DaF?

First, we will focus on the theoretical models that define an approach to translation and general and contrastive linguistics. We will define the notions of works and reading.

In a second step, we will deepen the notion of typologies of linguistic documents; this will provide tools for approaching the practical principles of the translation of contrastive linguistics.

Finally, methodologies will be developed for processing the text to be translated into German as a foreign language (DaF).
